#### "Religion or Relationship."

Holy week is just around the corner of the calendar. All around the globe people will be commemorating the final week of Jesus' (Son of Man) earthly life. Communities, Countries, Churches and individuals will attend or participate in pageants, mass and services or events that remind people of the life, suffering, death, burial, and resurrection of the Son of God. A privileged few will even have the experience of walking down the "Via Delarosa" - the Way of Suffering. The path church historians

believe Jesus walked through Jerusalem to Mt. Calvary for His execution on the cross.

It is pretty amazing that people of all color, tongue, and nation will have some of their citizens rejoice in this special week we call "Holy Week". But does it make any difference? What makes this week so special? Is it the music? The services? The traditions? The history? The Pageantry? I dare say that one can have many religious traditions and experiences without it making much of a difference. There are even groups in the world that are openly defiant

Against religion claiming religion is the cause of all evil in the world or at least the prohibitory of personal choice. And let's be honest, some reallyreally bad has been done in the name of religion (Twin Towers, Crusades, Dark Ages, etc...). But Holy Week is not a commemoration of religion. It is a reminder and declaration of reconciliation. A means by which a broken relationship can be restored.

All people are born into a cursed world. As a result of mankind's inherited nature to rebel and disobey our Creator, God, our divine Parent/Father, we were separated from relationship with Him. Romans 3:23 of the Bible declares, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Romans 6:23 goes on to say, "The wages of sin is death..." Death separates from life and God is life. Therefore our relationship with God is broken, severed by sin. All humanity is born into this condition and if that were the end of the story we would be most miserable and without hope. But Romans 6:23 concludes with these words, "...but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

It is this hope that is celebrated all year long, but especially during Holy Week. "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son (Jesus) and that whoever believes in Him would not perish (be separated from Him) but have everlasting life (relationship restored forever)," John 3:16. Jesus was born without the curse of sin because He was conceived of the Holy Spirit. He consciously chose not to disobey God relying upon the power of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, His life was pure and sinless, a sacrifice of perfection for our sins. Appeasing the wrath of God toward sin by the offering of the life of Jesus who knew no sin. And because Jesus is fully God, sin and death could not keep Him in the grave. He conquered them and rose again offering us salvation from sin and restored relationship with God. A free gift to us even though it cost Jesus His life.

This is what Christians are celebrating during Holy Week; not religion but relationship with God through Jesus Christ. And God offers this free gift to all people of all nations. "And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved." Pray that your family and neighbors repent of their sins and receive Jesus' free gift of salvation so that they can celebrate Holy Week with a new understanding.

April 23<sup>rd</sup> – macaroni and cheese, hot dogs, fruit cocktail, and peach cobbler


April 30<sup>th</sup> – soup and sandwich, chips and pickles, mandarin orange jello, and chocolate pudding
